# CONCEICAO RODRIGUES MEMORIAL DEBATE 2021

In order to succeed, your desire of success should be greater than your fear of failure.

Overcoming all the challenges posed by the Covid-19, Fr. Conceicao Rodrigues College of Engineering has successfully hosted its Flagship event, Conceicao Rodrigues Memorial Debate (CRMD), from 8th to 10th of October, 2021.Again the event was held online but that did not take away the enthusiasm professed by the debaters or the judges who partook in this prestigious event.

Identifying the indifference between the set of practices and moral values prevalent in the modern world, the theme for CRMD 2021 was - "The Emanation of Unbecoming Comportment"

CRMD is an intermediate Oxford-style debate competition and has always been praised by people who have witnessed it. Teams from all over India eagerly anticipate bagging the esteemed trophy with their debating intrepidity. The event was hosted on two popular video conferencing platforms, Google Meet and Zoom. The Semi-finals and Final debates were live on YouTube as well to ensure an immersive experience for all our viewers.

The much-anticipated debate had 32 laudable teams from all over the nation, grappling with their words for the first prize of Rs. 50,000, second prize for 30,000 and Rs. 10,000 for the best speaker and the best adjudicator. Teams from more than 15 states competed hard through the league rounds to acquire their positions in the quarter-finals.

Not only centring on the strengths and weaknesses of an argument but also providing frank but constructive feedback to each team to help them better, our Judges, who included experts from the field of Communication, Education, and Corporate world, judged every debate with immense grace and eloquence. Weighing every argument with equanimity, and deciding rankings in the house, an Adjudicator plays a vital role. Our Adjudicators consciously noted down all considerable points put forth by the debaters and provided them with productive feedback for the same.

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With astute arguments, the top 8 teams battled their way in quarters, putting forth excellent points. 4 teams emerged victoriously from the war of words and were qualified for the semifinals.

On 22<sup>nd</sup> -23<sup>rd</sup> January 2022, Fr. Conceicao Rodrigues Memorial Hackathon, "UNSCRIPT 2K22" was held. Hackathon's provide student developers an opportunity to explore their technical, soft and communication skills, probe their domain of interest, discover and develop new skills, overcome their weak areas and complete for fame and glory. The primary goal of this event was to boost the innovation culture and further establish the idea-sharing, effective collaboration and creativeness driven by enthusiasm towards a shared goal. The hackathon allowed the participants to connect with Industry personnel's, faculty mentors, and most importantly, with each other.

#### Planning:

Planning for the Hackathon began in October 2021. An external call was sent out to corporate partners for their association in any form possible. Sponsorships were confirmed from Devfolio, Polygon, taskade, Noticebard, Lets Upgrade, Leading Learners, ClickUp, StreamYard, hoverRobotix, Mentorx, Insynout tech, SAHU Technologies, Newolf Society, GeeksforGeeks, Tezos, Filecoin, celo. Weekly planning meetings were held throughout October-January, with an hour-by-hour timeline available to the organizers team, technical volunteers, and judges before the event.

#### Event Publicity:

The senior PR council members of both the councils divided the number of colleges equally amongst themselves as well as all the junior council members of both the councils and thus covered most of the engineering colleges of India. Posters were put up on all the social media platforms and was also published to a larger number of audience with the help of our media sponsors. Social Media platforms like Instagram, Facebook and LinkedIn were used to advertise about the Hackathon. MoU was signed with Devfolio, a digital platform that provides registration portal and does digital marketing of events. As a result of effective publicity we received a whooping 1000 plus registrations from across different colleges all over India.



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### Event Timeline:

On receiving 1000 plus registration, the short-listing process was initiated which included scrutinizing teams profile followed by a Google meet with all the registered teams. Later the teams were reduced to top 25 teams for the web development domain, top 20 teams for android development domain and top 14 teams for the Ai/ML domain. The results of the interview session along with the problem statements were announced by 21<sup>st</sup> January 2022. The inaugration ceremony was on 22<sup>st</sup> January 2022 morning at 10:30 am which was broadcasted live in YouTube. Our Program began with introductory session by our principal, Dr. Srija Unnikrishnan and our chief guest Miss. Ipsita Bhattacharya, HR, Project Manager At JP Morgan Chase & Co. The words of wisdom and advice given by our dignitaries were very enlightening and motivating which encouraged all the students to put their best in everything that they do and desire to do.

A common mentoring session was arranged from 11 am to 12 pm on 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2022 for all 3 domains in a Google Meet. Further a one-to-one mentoring session was arranged from 2 pm onwards which gave the participants a chance to clear their doubts with the mentors and also to get an idea about the places where they can improve. Further we had two evaluating sessions, one at 6:00 pm on 22nd January, 2022 for Web domain, at 7:00 pm for the App and Ai/ML domain and the second evaluating session was conducted on 23th January, 2022 at 6:30 am for Web domain and at 7:30 am for the App and Ai/ML domain. The evaluating session was carried out by calling each and every team from all 3 domains in separate Google meets. All the coordination with the teams was carried out through the discord channels. After the two evaluation rounds top 5 teams from the web development domain, top 5 teams from the android development domain and top 5 teams from the Ai/ML Domain were selected on the basis of their performances. The final judging round was scheduled from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm on 23<sup>st</sup> January, 2022. Google meets were conducted where each of the teams were called one by one. All the finalist teams had to present their presentations and show the implementations they came up with to the respective domain judges, the meeting was broadcasted on YouTube live. Presentations and judging round were wrapped up by 1:30 pm. This was followed by the Closing ceremony. The event started with a great speech by Mr. Sherwin Dsouza, VCP of ACM Council. The winners and runner up teams of Unscript Rookie's Hackathon were announced by Miss. Gini Chacko, VCP of CSI Council. The winners of each domain were rewarded with prize money of Rs. 10,000/-, First Runner up with prize money of Rs. 5000/- and the second runner up with prize money of Rs. 1,600/-. The ceremony ended with a vote of thanks to all the people who participated in the hackathon as judges, mentors, evaluators, organisers, participants and made the event a grand

Various channels for each team as well as separate channels for the mentors, judges and evaluators were created in order to carry out the communication process with them smoothly. All the doubts of the teams were cleared out by the organizers in their respective team channel and also there was common announcement channel were all the announcements were put up.





The Computer Society of India(C.S.I.), FR. C.R.C.E. organized a session on Workshop On Developing A CoronaVirus Tracker Software on 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2021. The objective of the session was to introduce and explain young minds the various aspects of how to start developing a software that hits various APIs and displays the number of coronavirus cases in the response.



A total of 49 students from SE, TE and 2 faculty members attended the meet. The mode of session delivery was Google Meet.



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Mr. Swastik Sharma (speaker)

The speaker for the workshop was Mr. Swastik Sharma. Mr. Swastik Sharma Works as a Java Developer at SunBase Data in the USA. Mr Sharma has taught over 600 students and carries 5 years of hands-on experience in robotics and software development. Mr Sharma has built over 15 major projects with various kinds of tech stacks. He has Won J.P. Morgan's Code for Good hackathon last month, Coding Competition at CRCE, multiple state and national level project exhibition competitions, national level paper presentation competition at Govt. Polytechnic, countless national and international level hackathons. He was also invited by Harvard University to attend the Harvard US-India Initiative Conference as a delegate.



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The workshop began with Mr. Swastik Sharma talking and sharing about himself and the work he does. He shared about his experience of coding different languages and gave a short introduction about his coronavirus tracker software. The first half of the session included a detailed explanation about







The speaker guided all the students in downloading the python setup in their respective devices and helped in setting up the python path required for programming as well.




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functions, dictionary creation in python, he taught basic programs that are required for the coronavirus tracker creation.

- The name of the country is entered in the text box which in response shows the record of corona cases of the respective country.



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

#### Various Pre-arrangement Planning:

1. Budge planning and approval from college

2.Transport: Get in touch with a bus agency who will be willing to provide 3-4 buses based on the size and seating capacity. Ask if the transportation charges covers all aspects such as tolls, petrol etc.

 Trek Guide: Get in touch with a trek guide and check his availability throughout the day and we might require 4-5 trek guides.

4. Breakfast and Lunch: Arrange for a healthy breakfast with help of a caterer and make sure good quality of food is being delivered. Place the order for the required number of boxes atleast 3 days prior. The breakfast should be delivered to college by 5:30am on 1st October. For Lunch, search a good restaurant on the way back to Bandra which is willing to accommodate 188 people and offer a discount.

5. Seating: finalize a seating arrangement between buses with 2 junior council members, 2 senior council members and a faculty member in each bus.

6. Consent forms: one week prior to trek, have the consent forms sent to students which are to be submitted latest a day prior to the trek.

7. Contact: Create a whatsapp group of all students who have registered along with faculty members and post all the information of Dos and Don'ts and things to bring, etc on that group.

8. Pick ups: pick up snacks, juice packs, water and first aid latest a day prior to trek.

#### Plan of action on trek day:

1. Council members to reach college by 5:15am at college.

- Make sure the breakfast and buses have arrived at the given time.
- 3. Board required items in the bus (breakfast, snacks, water, first aid, garbage bags, etc)

Guide the coming students and form lines according to buses.

#### Resume Building Workshop Report

Resumes become an integral part for students as well as professionals. With the idea to prepare students to create impactful resumes that would help them in applying for internships as well as in the future, the TEDxCRCE Council conducted a Resume Building Workshop on January 17, 2022 by Mrs. Ipsita Bhattacharya, an HR Project Manager at JP Morgan Chase and Co.

The event began with a short description of the program flow, followed by the introduction of the guest speaker. Mrs. Ipsita divided her talk into three sections wherein she described her experiences, gave an insight on how one can use LinkedIn effectively, and use the right strategies to network with professionals and organizations. She further added how to help recruiters know about the candidate in only a few words by taking care to add certain points and avoid the others. 
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
